Welcome to the **Transcend STEM [Security Trauma Emergency Medics] Suite Specification.** Transcend Awards is an awarding organisation regulated by Ofqual. The suite is developed in collaboration with the **British Training Board [BTB]** led by the esteemed education specialist **Adrian Rabey.**

The qualifications in this suite sit on the Ofqual Register of Regulated Qualifications. This specification must be complied with in conjunction with the *Transcend Centre Recognition Conditions, Qualification Unit Specifications* and the *BTB Approved Training and Assessment Materials*.

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Part 01: Qualification Suite Purpose Statement

Qualification Suite Scope

Transcend STEM [Security Trauma Emergency Medics] is a progressive suite of occupational qualifications regulated by Ofqual. The qualifications in this suite sit in sector 1.3: Health and Social Care, are developed in collaboration with the **British Training Board [BTB]** and solely awarded by Transcend. Due to the nature of the qualifications, they are delivered exclusively by BTB licenced medical education specialists. **The British Armed Forces recognise the BTB as independent education specialists** dedicated to supporting those in service, veterans, public servants, and their families throughout their careers and beyond.

The qualifications in this suite are relevant to the BTB community of military professionals, veterans and public servants. It is for those with emergency first aid experience who aspire to gain and retain employment in a security operations role. Learners will develop knowledge, skills and behaviours required to administer emergency first aid [level 3], respond to medical trauma [level 4] and for strategic leaders in a security operation to prevent and manage medical crises [level 5].

This suite is integral to the **Transcend BTB MVP¹ Portfolio**. This is a pioneering portfolio of qualifications developed specifically to align to the revolutionary **BTB Military Skills Translator Framework**. EQA Risk-Based Monitoring Approach

The recognised centre is required to cooperate with the external quality assurance activities conducted by the awarding organisation workforce. The external quality assurance approach determines the nature, frequency and sampling sizes as shown:

Scrutiny of the qualification workforce competence checks on 100% bookings

Scrutiny of the qualification delivery venue and facility safety via risk-based external **monitoring** activities.

Scrutiny of the qualification coordination timings and accuracy via risk-based external **monitoring** activities.

Scrutiny of the qualification delivery to prepare learners for assessment via risk-based external **monitoring** activities.

Scrutiny of the qualification assessment standards via risk-based external **moderation** interventions.

Scrutiny of the qualification internal quality assurance via risk-based external **moderation** interventions.

The external **monitoring** activities take place during external **moderation** interventions. This enables us to evaluate compliance across the breadth of the centre recognition and supplementary qualification approval conditions at the same time as scrutinizing the assessment standards.

This enables us to maximise the application of our resources. Our **external quality assurance reports** may be communicated per moderation intervention in a matrix via email or via the web based in the Transcend Awarding Management System via TAMS. This is dependent on the number of learners to be certificated and the level of compliance of the recognised centre in the delivery of the qualifications.

We will collaborate with each centre to determine this. The rationale is to ensure efficiency in our reporting and certifications. Where a matrix approach is adopted, these will be collated periodically and uploaded into TAMS for audit purposes. All moderation outcomes will also be reported via TAMS bookings to ensure that all records are maintained in the system.



EQA Risk-Based CASS Strategies

The recognised centre is required to cooperate with the awarding organisation's risk-based external moderation interventions. External moderation a form of **Centre Assessment Standards Scrutiny** for assessment which is marked by the centre to ensure that standards have been maintained and to adjust results where they have not.

EQA Risk Based PORTFOLIO Moderation Strategies: The moderation strategy for portfolios is associated with the assessor's experience in delivering the qualifications, the risk profile assigned to the qualifications and the recognised centre qualification approval risk profile. EQA Risk Based REAL-TIME ASSESSMENT Moderation Strategies: The moderation strategies for real time assessment are associated with the **risk** profile assigned to each qualification in this suite Real time assessment is defined as assessments where the learner and the assessor are present. In this qualification suite this refers to practical demonstrations and professional discussions.

RTA Strategy: EQA Presence and moderation annually as a minimum to all centres, per qualification, per real time assessment and biannually where there are 100-200 learners and for every 200+ learners thereafter.

² The term **across booking** is associated with a period which will be confirmed per centre dependent on the number of requests for certification within that time period. All learners within this time period per assessor will be considered to be a cohort.

Qualification Suite Risk Profiles
